

Ordinary Council Meeting of Tuesday 29 of June.

3 councilors of the PSOE were absent, one for medical reason.

Public: only 7 persons attended the meeting.

Most important points:

- Calle D.Antonio Lafuente Aliaga: this will be the new name of the street between "El Cruce de Periana" and Venta Baja, in honor of the gift of part of his property, years ago, to connect with Venta Baja. The usual access was impossible due to bad weather conditions.
The PSOE councilor asked for the origin of a street called Calle 6 de Febrero. Nobody had an answer. It will be investigated.
- Point 8 of the agenda is postponed due to the absence of the PSOE councillor who was going to defend the motion.
- Point 9: Urgent Matters.
The debate is about the salary reduction of public service workers. The new law will be applied and the reduction of salaries applied accordingly. The Major defends that the salaries of the elected people will not be modified. The reason for this is that when the new team entered the Town Hall, they voluntarily cut their salaries drastically. For example, the Major is earning 30% less than the former Major. (23.000€/year before taxes). The salaries of the elected people is about 45% below the recommendations of the FEM (Federación Española de pequeños Municipios). The PSOE councilor insists that for esthetic reason, a reduction of 50€/month would have been applauded.
- Questions from the Public.
 - Some parts of the road connecting Venta Baja and Venta Alta are extremely deteriorated. When will this be solved? The councilor on urbanism, Domingo Lozano, answered that this is unfortunately the exclusive responsibility of the Junta de Andalucía.
 - When will the promised new internet provider start? According to the Mayor, the last of the 4 repeaters are being installed now, so the new provider will probably start to operate in August.
 - There is a fierce dispute between the PSOE and the other members of the council about the money that has been announced on several posters by the "Jovenes Socialistas". This money has apparently been allocated to Alcaucín to improve several streets and public infrastructure. "So far, we haven't received a single penny" said the Mayor.
